Use this to promote additional interest and encourage individual participation in the MELD program

<u>Net growth in lodge membership</u>- meeting the goals listed above will enable our lodge to meet the mission. By meeting the mission for 2019 we are further advanced closer to our vision. By training and educating our members and increasing our participation in lodge meetings and events as well as community events, we will increase the visibility and improve the public perception of who we are and what we do.


